

## Defining accreditation

Accreditation is the ongoing formal recognition of the competence, impartiality and integrity of a conformity assessment body to perform specific task or activity to the relevant standard.

#### Conformity assessment examples:

- + Testing COVID-19 antigen tests
- + Inspection Passenger lifts
- + Certification ISO 9001 Quality Management
- + Verification and validation Emissions trading scheme (greenhouse gas report verification)

## Conformity Assessment Body (CAB) activities

- + Medical Laboratories and examinations (ISO 15189)
- + Laboratories Calibration & Testing (ISO/IEC 17025)

- + Certification Bodies MS certification (ISO/IEC 17021)
- + Certification Bodies Certification of persons (ISO/IEC 17024)

+ Certification Bodies - Product certification (ISO/IEC 17065)

+ Point of Care Testing Providers (ISO 22870)

+ Inspection (ISO/IEC 17020)

+ Validation and Verification (ISO 14065)


+ Reference Material Producers (ISO 17034) + Proficiency Testing Providers (ISO/IEC 17043)



+ Certification is the assessment of whether a management system, product, or person meets the criteria laid out in a recognised standard or scheme.

+ Accreditation is the determination of the competence of the certification body to perform specific activities under a recognised international or national standard or scheme.

## + The value of accreditation


UKAS accreditation is recognised and accepted globally, reducing technical barriers to international trade.
